Call to Order:

Meeting was called to order by Nancy McKenney at 9:02 AM

Approval of Agenda:

A motion to except the Agenda was made by Jim Johnson and seconded by John Keeley. Motion approved - unanimously.

Approval of Minutes:

A motion to approve the minutes as recorded from the Oct. 7th, 2017 meeting was introduced by Cindy Schmeisser. The motion was seconded by John Keeley. Motion approved – unanimously

Commissioners Reports:

Chairperson Report – Nancy McKenney had nothing new to report but wanted it noted in the minutes that the transition from Tracy Kupsh to Cindy Schmeisser as new treasurer has gone extremely well. This is due to the excellent work done by Tracy over the last 9 years and her continued efforts through the transition as well as Cindy's ability to quickly assimilate all of the tasks necessary for the position.

Secretary Report – Jim Johnson shared that he had sent all the necessary paperwork to Tracy Boeing of Ansay & Associates to renew our D&O Policy for 2018 (\$916 will be the cost this year). The invoice will be sent to Cindy Schmeisser's address for payment.

Treasurers Report – Tracy Kupsh shared with the group the Jan. 2018 balance sheet (Appendix 1). The report showed Current Funds on Hand to be **\$23,746.88 which** matches the current bank statement. She noted that all taxes have been paid for 2017 with no outstanding balance. Cindy and Tracy discussed the timing and logistics necessary to transfer the signing power on the checkbook.

Aquatic Habitat Committee – Paul Lasee was in attendance at the meeting and reported that all discussions with the DNR were complete on the "Fish Sticks" project. He reported that 15 residences have signed up for the program. Paul stated that he secured a 5 year permit for the project and paid \$310.58 out of his pocket (Appendix 1 – Invoice). Cindy will forward a check to Paul as soon as she has the signing power for the Districts checkbook. All funds for the project were in the 2018 budget.

Unfinished Business:

Nancy still needs to get Doyle and Helen Curtis their "Friends are Devine Award". She will also contact Joe Siudzinski regarding the tree (Sugar Maple) to be donated to the Town of Beecher as part of their "Friends are Devine Award". Finally, information was exchanged so Nancy can update the Roles and Responsibilities Document for the District.

Next meeting will be on the 19th of May, 2018.


Adjournment:
